# Director's Note

Thank you for joining us for *Dance Nation*. We're so glad you are here. We've been trying to bring you this play for four years - since before our dads died and since before social distancing and double vaccine boosters and the latest variants were all we talked about. Most plays probably wouldn't have held our attention for so long, but this play seemed to have a future that haunted us. Maybe because it's a play about persistence and friendship. Or maybe it's because these last four years have been a time of great transition for all of us, and this play dances in that space of transition, when the world is confusing and we are unsure of who we want to become. Or maybe we stuck with it because it's so rare to find a play that is about girls and women that doesn't center narratives of trauma, but instead is vibrant and visceral; a play that contradicts the shame and humiliation of being socialized as a girl without being precious; a play that seeps into the selves we carry with us and reclaims those selves with feral-ness and laughter. Or maybe it was simply because we had the rights to the regional premiere, and we're ambitious bitches and we thought, "We're comin' for you Boulder, CO!"

At one point during this rehearsal process, I had a dream that there should be no more declarative theatre - you know, the kind of theatre that pretends to have all the answers. From now on - in the dream, at least - I vowed to only do theatre that lived in the non-binary, the nuanced, the both/and. It felt revelatory and profound. I was sure I was on to something. Of course, a few nights later I had a dream that Drake sat me on his lap and was totally hot for me, so...

The point is that this play doesn't claim to have an answer. It's not math. Instead, it lives and moves in that liminal space, where nothing is just one way and everything still seems possible. Even Drake.

More than anything, we hope you enjoy the play as much as we do - the charm, the chaos, and the candy-coated possibilities. We hope you remember yourself; remember the 'you' you once were and the 'you' you dreamed yourself to be. That you remember the 'you' who believed you were destined for greatness, the you who thought, surely "It's written in the stars." This play is for you.
